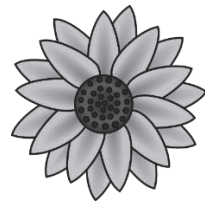

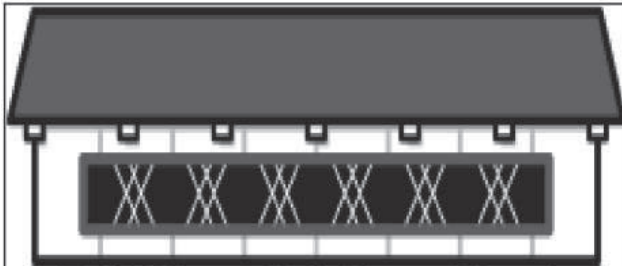

## Honored Veteran 2026 - Jim Mask

Born February 15, 1966 in Eugene, Oregon son of James and Sandra S. Mask.

I moved to Scio, Oregon at a young age, and it was a wonderful place to grow up in the 1970s and 1980s. I was blessed with supportive parents and a deeply involved extended family. Athletics quickly became a central part of my life, and I was fortunate to be surrounded by dedicated volunteer coaches who invested countless hours in our generation. Leaders like Dean Ferguson, Bill Allen, Tom Mask, Jim Cole, Bob Stearns, Gordon Harper, Chuck Bates, and many others gave us every opportunity to succeed—not just in sports, but in life.

After graduating from Scio High School in 1984, I worked various jobs and attended Linn-Benton Community College and Western Oregon University. Even during that time, I felt a strong obligation to serve our country. My father and uncle both served during the height of the Vietnam War, and I believed that if they could serve during such a challenging time, I could serve during a more peaceful one.

I joined the United States Army in August 1987 and served until November 1994. From Basic Training at Fort Dix, New Jersey, to Advanced Individual Training at Fort Devens, Massachusetts, and through each of my duty assignments, I valued every part of my Army experience.

My first assignment was at Field Station Kunia in Hawaii, where I served as a Counterintelligence/Electronic Warfare/Signals Intelligence Morse Intercept Operator. I later served at Naval Air Station Key West, Florida, before returning to Field Station Kunia. At both locations, we carried out live missions that were challenging, meaningful, and rewarding.

After completing my military service, I returned to Oregon and used the GI Bill to attend Chemeketa Community College. It was there that I met my wife of nearly 30 years, Chelle. Together we have three children—Mackenzie, Jayson, and Nathan—and five grandchildren: Myles, Easton, Macy, Kinnlee, and Mayson.

While attending Chemeketa, I began working for Hewlett-Packard, where I spent 19 years. During that time, I earned my bachelor's degree from Linfield University. I later accepted the position of IT Manager at Scio School District, where I have worked for the past 12 years. When offered the role, I was also asked to serve as Athletic Director—an opportunity I was proud to accept, as athletics has always been one of my passions. Over the past 22 years, I have coached high school football, baseball, and softball.

My time in the military shaped who I am in profound ways. My drill sergeant, Sergeant Torrez, used to say, "Joe—you don't know nothing about nothing." He called everyone Joe. At the time, he was right. What I gained in the Army went far beyond technical skills. I learned humility, the importance of putting the team before yourself, and how to work alongside people from all backgrounds toward a common goal.

## Scio's Historical ZCJB Hall

In the Spring of 1920, the Western Czech Brotherhood had raised enough funds to build a new lodge in Scio. This was about the same time that Bohemia and Slovakia merged to form the new country of Czechoslovakia in the northwestern corner of the old Austro-Hungarian Empire that had crumbled during World War I.

Many of Scio's early settlers were of Czech ancestry and had come to America to escape the repressions of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. The brotherhood formed by the Czech settlers was much like the Grange formed by the English settlers, using their halls for social events and as a life insurance cooperative. The name of the brotherhood in Czech is: Zapadni Czesko Bratraska Jednota (ZCJB) which translates to Western Czechoslovakian Fraternal Association.

After the completion of the Scio lodge in 1922, it quickly became the center of social activities in town. Polka dances were held on Saturday nights, drawing many people from miles around. Community companionship was enjoyed at the many potlucks and dinners featuring Czech dumplings, sausages and kolaches. The Hall could even be transformed into a gymnasium for use by area children who attended organized gymnastics and competitions. The ZCJB continued their lodge meetings and community activities until 1993, when, because of dwindling numbers and ever-increasing age of members, they deeded their hall to the Linn County Lamb and Wool Fair Association with the requirement that the hall would continue to be used as a community center.

Today The Hall is used for a myriad of functions including, weddings, receptions, anniversaries, memorials, banquets, meetings, exercise classes, fundraisers, concerts, plays, auctions, flea markets, reunions, luncheons, and parties. 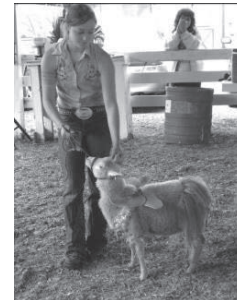

- Class 11 – Senior – 10<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade (showing at least 2<sup>nd</sup> year)
- Class 12 – Intermediate – 7<sup>th</sup> grade through 9<sup>th</sup> grade (showing at least 2<sup>nd</sup> year)
- Class 13 – Junior -- 6<sup>th</sup> grade (showing at least 2<sup>nd</sup> year)
- Class 14 – Novice (first year showing – regardless of age)



## Lamb Show Rules:

- 1) Exhibitors must show their own animals in all classes without assistance. Only the exhibitor will be allowed in the ring.
- 2) No halters allowed except in Class 9 Dress Up and Class 10 Pee-Wee Showmanship.
- 3) Market lambs may only show in the market class. Ewe lambs may not be shown in both breeding and market classes.
- 4) Lambs may only be shown in one showmanship class (Classes 11-14).
- 5) Any lamb that is exhibiting signs of any illness (i.e., soremouth or club lamb fungus) will not be allowed in the show. If your lamb is experiencing one of these things, please be considerate of others and leave them at home.
