



Pie Eating Contest




The pie eating contest will be held on the Carol Bates Memorial Stage Friday, May 17th at 4:00 pm. There will be four age categories:

You may also recognize his voice from the many as an announcer for a multitude of different sports. He helped build the Scio Youth Club concession trailer and hauled it to many games, auctions and Lamb and Wool Fairs to help raise money for the club. For 20 years, Jim was also a Scio volunteer firefighter, where he worked with Chief Mike Murphy. Jim has always loved all sports. He enjoyed watching his kids play and now gets to enjoy watching his grandkids. He is also a regular spectator at the Scio home games.

Jim's other hobbies include winning a game of cribbage, playing pinochle, drinking coffee at the Covered Bridge and crabbing and clamming at the coast. His latest adventure was jumping out of an airplane to commemorate his 80th birthday! His proudest accomplishment is his family, which includes 10 grandchildren, and 6 great grandchildren. He claims to have danced at the Lamb and Wool Fair with all of his granddaughters at some point over the years.

Introducing our Honored Citizen Michelle LeFeber



Michelle LeFeber came to work in Scio in the fall of 2000 when she hired to teach 1st grade at Centennial Elementary. She had previously been teaching for a year at Gates Elementary after graduating from Western Oregon University. She taught 1st grade for 9 years and has spent the last 15 years teaching 2nd grade. She loves the excitement and love of learning that working with younger students brings. During the 22/23 school year, she had her first 2nd generation student (she taught both her mom and dad). She's sure there will be many more before her retirement.

She has been involved in many different roles throughout her years in Scio. She has served on numerous school and district committees, has been a mentor to many new teachers as well as worked with student teachers for local colleges. Michelle was the president of the Scio Classroom Teachers


Association for 8 years and is currently the treasurer.

In addition to those things, most recently Michelle became the teacher leader of Scio district's New Teacher Mentor Program. This program helps new to our district teachers partner with existing teachers to receive mentorship. She works to bring training resources to them in order to address the issue of teacher retention in our small schools. "We want to attract and keep great teachers in Scio," Michelle said.

Michelle was chosen in the fall of 2023 as the Oregon Small Schools Teacher of the Year. She was recognized for her 24 years of service to Scio's schools as well as her work with their mentoring program. She said "it was a great honor to travel to Portland and speak to the members of the Oregon Small Schools Association not only about myself but the amazing things happening in Scio's schools."

Michelle is married to her husband, Eric and has 4 children, Kobe LeFeber, Ben Shown, Tyra LeFeber and Jett LeFeber.

We Salute Our Honored Vet Gunnery Sergeant (GySgt) USMC Matt McSorley

Matt McSorley was born and raised in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, growing up in a rough neighborhood of the city. In 2002, while a junior in high school, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps. Upon high school graduation, he attended Marine Corps boot camp in Parris Island, SC, combat and engineer training at Camp Lejeune, NC, and was stationed in Camp Pendleton, CA.

He then deployed to Iraq in 2004 aboard naval ships, first providing aid in Sri Lanka and Indonesia following a devastating tsunami. Completing combat operations in 2005 (Al Hillah, modern-day Babylon), he returned

home in 2005. He then deployed and conducted combat operations in Iraq in 2006 (Al-Fallujah) and 2008 (Al-Qa'im).

While visiting the Statue of Liberty on leave in 2008, he received a call that he was selected to join Marine Special Operations and to return immediately. After completing extensive training, he was deployed to Helmand, Afghanistan with Marine Special Operations in 2010. During this time, he was part of village stability operations, living among the local population with a small team. In the month of November, while out detecting for explosives on a nighttime patrol, he was responsible for providing immediate medical aid to four team members and coordinating their evacuation from the battlefield, all survived with injuries. In total, he was involved in five direct explosions, countless rocket and mortar fires, and numerous engagements with the enemy.

In 2011, while receiving treatment with the Defense and Veterans Brain Injury Center (DVBIC) at Camp Pendleton, CA, he was selected to deploy again to Afghanistan. It was during this deployment that he decided to leave active duty after the loss of three of his mentors from an insider attack and being subjected to an NCIS investigation; that was later dismissed. He intended to focus on his role as a father and husband, and following his wife's recommendation, they moved their family to her hometown of Scio and purchased a house in the Jordan area.

Learning that there were no fire and EMS volunteers for this area, he joined the Scio Fire District in 2015. He completed the Santiam Fire Academy as the first member of Scio FD to receive the "Ember Award" given to the top recruit. He then used skills gained from the Marine Corps to complete high-angle rope, confined space, and swift water rescue training. In addition, going above the required training and completing all levels of firefighter and apparatus operations. He was certified by DPSST as an engine boss for wildfire operations,

fire officer 2, hazmat incident commander, Firefighter instructor 1, and public education and life safety instructor. He is also a certified EMT-B, having worked with the Jefferson and Lyons Fire Departments.

In 2018, he was deployed to Central America as a member of the Marine Corps Reserve. During this deployment, he served as an operations chief overseeing multiple school and hospital construction projects in several countries such as Guatemala, Honduras, Colombia, and Belize. He also found time to help instruct Honduran firefighters, alongside the Air Force firefighters. He spent the Fourth of July in Cuba that year and was sent to Guatemala to provide engineering expertise after a volcano had destroyed several villages west of Guatemala City.

Returning home to his family in 2019, he continued to volunteer with Scio Fire District throughout the Beachie Creek fire, remaining and observing conditions in the Jordan area while updating the neighbors daily with information. While his wife and children were evacuated to the Linn County Fairgrounds. In 2019, he also began working with Jefferson Fire District throughout the pandemic until the end of 2022.

Matt is extremely blessed to be the father of five children, all still in school. Two of his children continue to set personal records in cross country and track & field which he is extremely proud. He continues to work in EMS and is a member of the Marine Corps Reserve, celebrating his 21st year as a Marine.

His children are his soul drive in life and he can often be found teaching them "dangerous things safely." This includes doing science experiments, exploring nature, auto and home repair, farm and gardening, and firearm safety. He most recently took his children on a cross-country road trip towing a travel trailer from Oregon to Texas to North Carolina and up the East Coast to Washington DC to see their mom who was away training as a member of the Oregon Army National Guard. They continued to Philadelphia and across the northern part of the country, seeing all the major attractions along the way home.

He is a member of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus, and an active member of the community, always lending help and assistance where he can.







Scio's Historical ZCBJ Hall

In the Spring of 1920, the Western Czech Brotherhood had raised enough funds to build a new lodge in Scio. This was about the same time that Bohemia and Slovakia merged to form the new country of Czechoslovakia in the northwestern corner of the old Austro-Hungarian Empire that had crumbled during World War I.

Many of Scio's early settlers were of Czech ancestry and had come to America to escape the repressions of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. The brotherhood formed by the Czech settlers was much like the Grange formed by the English settlers, using their halls for social events and as a life insurance cooperative. The name of the brotherhood in Czech is: Zapadni Czesko Bratrska Jednota (ZCBJ) which translates to Western Czechoslovakian Fraternal Association.

After the completion of the Scio lodge in 1922, it quickly became the center off social activities in town. Polka dances were held on Saturday nights, drawing many people from miles around. Community companionship was enjoyed at the many potlucks and dinners featuring Czech dumplings, sausages and kolaches. The Hall could even be transformed into a gymnasium fir use by area children who attended i\organized gymnastics and competitions. The ZCBJ continued their lodge meetings and community activities until 1993, when, because of dwindling numbers and ever-increasing age of members, they deeded their hall to the Linn County Lamb and Wool Fair Association with the requirement that the hall would continue to be used as a community center.

Today The Hall is used for myriad of functions including, weddings, receptions, anniversaries, memorials, banquets, meetings, exercise classes, fundraisers, concerts, plays, auctions, flea markets, reunions, luncheons, and parties. 



Lamb Show Rules:

- 1) Exhibitors must show their own animals in all classes without assistance. Only the exhibitor will be allowed in the ring.
- 2) No halters allowed except in Class 9 Dress Up and Class 10 Pee-Wee Showmanship.
- 3) Market lambs may only show in the market class. Ewe lambs may not be shown in both breeding and market classes.
- 4) Lambs may only be shown in one showmanship class (Classes 11-14).
- 5) Any lamb that is exhibiting signs of any illness (i.e., soremouth or club lamb fungus) will not be allowed in the show. If your lamb is experiencing one of these things, please be considerate of others and leave them at home.
