Introducing Our Honored Citizen, Ida Ruby



Ida Ruby moved to Scio from West Linn, OR in 1966 when she married local dairy farmer Ray Ruby. The farm lifestyle came easy to Ida, as she was the second of four children born to Swiss dairy farmers Rudolph and Esther Luscher, who owned and operated a prominent registered Holstein herd in West Linn. She and Ray met while Ida was driving her father to a Holstein Association activity. At the time, she was working in the office of a large furniture manufacturing firm in Portland, but her fate as a third-generation dairy farmer was set, and Fir-Ridge Holstein Farm has been going strong ever since. The husband-and-wife team grew their dairy business together over the next 45 years, and Ida

and her family have kept the farm going since Ray passed in 2010.

Soon after Ida moved to Scio she started working full-time at the local bank, milking cows before and after work. Throughout Ida's banking career she won numerous statewide banking achievement awards for her work in setting up investment plans for people in the community. This was quite a feat coming from Scio's rural population, up against the investment portfolios of her colleagues in the Portland metropolitan area. After a 30-year career at the bank, she retired in the mid-90's, but would continue to apply her financial skills to many other areas of her life, including starting and growing scholarship programs and serving as a treasurer for several non-profit organizations. She has worked closely with the Scio Scholarship Foundation, Linn-Benton Dairy Women, Oregon Dairy Women, Oregon Holstein Association, Holstein Women's Scholarship program, and she still manages all financial aspects of Fir-Ridge Holstein Farm to this day. While Ida worked full-time in her banking career, her heart was in her family and their growing dairy farm. Her two children, Scott and Michele, both graduated from Scio High School and after living in other parts of the country have returned to Scio. Ida's greatest joy is in her nine grandchildren.

Ida has been recognized for her achievements with the OSU Diamond Pioneer Award, Holstein Association USA National Distinguished Leader Award, Oregon Dairy Women Appreciation Award, Oregon Dairy Farmers Association Community Service Award, Scio FFA Honorary Chapter Farmer Degree, and Oregon FFA Honorary State Farmer Degree to name a few.



Honored Veteran 2023

Cory H. Carlson - Airframes Master Chief Petty Officer

AFCM (AW) United States Navy

Cory H. Carlson is a native of Scio, Oregon. He entered Naval Service in June 1987. Upon completion of Basic Training and Aviation Structural Mechanic (AME "A" School) at Naval Air Technical Training Center, Millington, TN, his first tour of duty was at Pacific Missile Range Facility (Barking Sands) Kauai, HI. He performed duties with the UH-3 helicopter, and associated aircraft and aircrew survival equipment. In August 1989 he reported for duty at Patrol Squadron Nineteen at NAS Moffett Field, CA. performing maintenance on the P-3C Orion aircraft.

Following training on the F-14 Tomcat in 1991, he reported to VX-4 at NAS Point Mugu, CA. This operational test squadron operated both F-14 and F/A-18 aircraft of varying models. He took part in 12 separate detachments for various weapon system tests at various sites across the United States. Next he was off to North Island, CA. an assignment to the Fighting Red Griffins of VS-38. There he worked as Leading Petty Officer of two work centers maintaining the Lockheed S-3B Viking. He made deployments aboard USS CONSTELLATION (CV-64) in 1994/95 and 1997 to WESTPAC, Arabian Gulf and the Sea of Japan. Prior to his transfer in September 1998 he was promoted to Chief Petty Officer.

He reported to Navy Recruiting District Portland in November 1998 where he was assigned as Recruiter-In-Charge of the Eugene/Springfield station. During his tour at NRD Portland he earned the distinction as the Willamette Zone, 2001 Recruiter of the Year as well as 18 Gold Wreath Awards for recruiting excellence. In February 2002 he headed to NAS Whidbey Island, WA, to the VAQ-141 Shadowhawks. Managing the daily maintenance on the EA-6B Prowler as Aircraft Division Chief, Maintenance Control desk Chief, Quality Assurance Supervisor, and Flight Deck Coordinator until being promoted to Senior Chief in 2005 when he took over as Maintenance Control Supervisor. He made two deployments aboard the USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) to the Mediterranean Sea and Arabian Gulf in support of "Operation Iraqi Freedom".

In 2006 he assumed the duties as Staff Department and Maintenance Training Unit, Leading Chief Petty Officer at CNATTU, NAS Whidbey Island until May 2008 when he assumed the role as Senior Enlisted Leader. In 2009 he was selected for Master Chief while assigned to VAQ-134 and deployed to Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan. During that deployment he received orders to VFA-14 "Tophatters" homeported at NAS Lemoore, CA as the Maintenance Master Chief. He met the F/A-18E fighter squadron while deployed aboard the USS NIMITZ (CVN-68) in January 2010. Shortly after their return from deployment the squadron transitioned from CAG-11 to CAG-9 to be deployed two more times aboard the USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN-74) in support of operations IRAQI and ENDURING FREEDOM.

In 2013 he reported to Naval Air Systems Command, Patuxent River, MD providing support and oversight under the cognizance of NAVAIR to two Test Wings and various Test & Evaluation sites across the country. Master Chief Carlson returned to NAS Whidbey Island in 2016. Joining the VAQ-133 Wizards just weeks prior to the squadron's maiden deployment with the new EA-18G Growler. Once again a part of the CAG-9 and the USS JOHN C. STENNIS (CVN-74) strike group, he completed his last Western Pacific deployment.

Married to his wife Tamryn since 1988, they have been blessed with four children and soon to be fourth grandchild. His family had been there to support his career through 22 household moves, eight geographic locations, nine deployment cycles and numerous aircraft detachments and challenging assignments throughout his 30 year career.

Lamb Show

The Lamb Show has been an integral part of the Linn County Lamb & Wool Fair since its beginning in 1935. The 2023 show on May 21st, is open to all youth in Oregon. Registration begins at 8 am on Sunday at the Big Red Pavilion. The show will begin at approximately 9:00 am or as soon as registration is finished.

Breeding Classes

Class 1 – Purebred Meat Type Ewe Lamb

Class 2 - Cross Bred Ewe Lamb

Class 3 – Wool Type Ewe Lamb

Class 4 – Pair of Ewe Lambs

Market Class

Class 5 – Market Lamb (divided into classes by weight and number of entries)

Class 6 - Pair of Market Lambs

Special Class

Class 7 – Pen of 3 – Must include both breeding and market lambs

Class 8 – Club or Chapter flock (minimum of 5 animals – shown by 3 or more members)

Class 9* -- Dress Up Your Lamb Contest

Class 10 - Pee-Wee Showmanship

Showmanship

Class 11 – Senior – 10th through 12th grade (showing at least 2nd year)

Class 12 – Intermediate – 7th grade through 9th grade (Showing at least 2nd year)

Class 13 – Junior -- 6th grade (Showing at least 2nd year)

Class 14 – Novice (first year showing – regardless of age)

Lamb Show Rules:

- 1) Exhibitors must show their own animals in all classes without assistance. Only the exhibitor will be allowed in the ring.
- 2) No halters allowed except in Class 9 Dress Up and Class 10 Pee-Wee Showmanship.
- 3) Market lambs may only show in the market class. Ewe lambs may not be shown in both breeding and market classes.
- 4) Lambs may only be shown in one showmanship class (Classes 11-14).
- 5) Any lamb that is exhibiting signs of any illness (i.e., soremouth or club lamb fungus) will not be allowed in the show. If your lamb is experiencing one of these things, please be considerate of others and leave them at home.





Scio's Historical ZCBJ Hall

In the Spring of 1920, the Western Czech Brotherhood had raised enough funds to build a new lodge in Scio. This was about the same time that Bohemia and Slovakia merged to form the new country of Czechoslovakia in the northwestern corner of the old Austro-Hungarian Empire that had crumbled during World War I.

Many of Scio's early settlers were of Czech ancestry and had come to America to escape the repressions of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. The brotherhood formed by the Czech settlers was much like the Grange formed by the English settlers, using their halls for social events and as a life insurance cooperative. The name of the brotherhood in Czech is: Zapadni Czesko Bratrska Jednota (ZCBJ) which translates to Western Czechoslovakian Fraternal Association.

After the completion of the Scio lodge in 1922, it quickly became the center off social activities in town. Polka dances were held on Saturday nights, drawing many people from miles around. Community companionship was enjoyed at the many potlucks and dinners featuring Czech dumplings, sausages and kolaches. The Hall could even be transformed into a gymnasium fir use by area children who attended i\organized gymnastics and competitions. The ZCBJ continued their lodge meetings and community activities until 1993, when, because of dwindling numbers and ever-increasing age of members, they deeded their hall to the Linn County Lamb and Wool Fair Association with the requirement that the hall would continue to be used as a community center.

Today The Hall is used for myriad of functions including, weddings, receptions, anniversaries, memorials, banquets, meetings, exercise classes, fundraisers, concerts, plays, auctions, flea markets, reunions, luncheons, and parties. 


